Our local production ran for four years, 1560 performances, and was seen by 2.9 million people. Around the world the show has been seen by more than 100 million people in 25 different productions. The creative team, led by Director Julie Taymor, wanted to craft an immersive theatrical experience that was completely unique. To achieve this the show is populated by more than 232 different puppets, from rod puppets to shadow puppets and beyond. Some of the puppeteered headpieces weigh less than a banana!
